**CALL TO ORDER:** Mayor Pfaff called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

**ROLL CALL:** Mayor Pfaff, David Ulrick, Cande Hasenoehrl, Neal Leon, Tom Tevlin Mark Young, Officer Snead. Staff: Nancy Whitesell – Clerk/Treasurer, Public Works – Shon Clark, Mark Phillips

**INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS:** Connie Schaut, Steve Nelson

Steve Nelson from Century West explained to Council the progress being made in the I&I Sewer Plant project. The Town is looking at a \$29,000 loan on a \$125,000 grant. The Town has also received a \$700,000 grant for pipe lining in 2020.

**APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES:** August 14th, 2019 Regular Council Meeting. Dave Ulrick **MOVED** to approve the minutes. Mark Young seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

**POLICE REPORT:** Terry Snead to report: The problem area on Adams St has been very quiet. A red vehicle that was involved in some problems up there is now for sale in Idaho. Chief Neumann met with the District Attorney today about an ongoing case in town. It is still moving forward. There has been a resolution as to complaints about a dog up on Cleveland St. Officer Snead explained that the laws pertaining to the situation are very straight forward and is a state law. Officer Snead will be focusing on patrol for hay and grain trucks that have been speeding through town.

**PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:** Shon Clark to report: There is a water leak on the sprinkler system in the park, causing a mess at the park. It has been sectioned off. Public Works cannot get it fixed at this time for fear they will tear everything up and make a big mess. They are waiting until it's time to shut the water off to the park. When they do this, it will also shut water off to the restrooms. They plan to wait it out if possible. There was also discussion of a new sprinkler system. A dead tree was also removed from the park. WWTP has had no violations during the month of July. They took the opportunity of the weather and cleaned the streets. There was also work on Spokane between 8<sup>th</sup> St and 10<sup>th</sup> St. 10<sup>th</sup> St has been made passable although it is not a maintained street. Shon has ordered parts for the jetter, and the garbage truck has been washed.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Cande Hasenoehrl asked about the progress of clean up that was requested for a property on 4<sup>th</sup> St. Nancy Whitesell explained that she had spoken to the owner and he stated he is still aware it needs to be done and will get to it.

Mayor Pfaff brought up previous conversation about raising the sewer rates \$5.00 to correct an error that was made in a previous year. Tom Tevlin **MOVED** to approve Resolution 2019-08 increase sewer rates \$5.00 effective October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Mark Young seconded. The motion passed with Neal Leon voting nay.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**FINANCIAL:** Approval of checks – Dave Ulrick **MOVED** to approve payment of checks. Neal Leon seconded, and the motion passed.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Mark Young **MOVED** to enter executive session. Neal Leon seconded, and the session began at 7:32pm. Mark Young **MOVED** to end the executive session. Tom Tevlin seconded, and the session ended at 7:48 pm.

**ADJOURN:** Mark Young **MOVED** to adjourn the meeting. Cande Hasenoehrl seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:48 pm.
